

The Ross Med campus is located in Bridgetown, the capital of the small

Caribbean island nation of Barbados, but a majority of our students come from the United States and Canada—where most of our nearly 15,000 alumni now practice medicine.

As a Ross Med student, you will spend your first two years of medical school at our Barbados campus before completing two years of clinical training at affiliated hospitals in the United States.

Upon successful completion of our program, you will be awarded a Doctor of Medicine (MD) degree.

Hands-On From the Start

As a Ross Med student, you are immersed in learning the practice of medicine. You gain experience in simulation labs, train alongside physicians, and care for real patients in the community within weeks, not months.

- At Ross Med, you get early clinical experience in the classroom and in the real world.
- · Active learning experiences support traditional lecture and case-based learning.
- Early clinical exposures include participation in mobile and pop-up clinics, assisting in mental health care settings, supervised patient home visits, and more.

- Our partnerships with historically Black colleges and universities (HBCUs) and Hispanic-serving institutions (HSIs) provide further opportunities for exceptional students.


Our Demographics



Hands-On Medical Sciences

Through Ross Med's enhanced five-semester organ system-based modular curriculum, you will learn how the physiological, anatomical, and biochemical processes of each organ system work together, providing you with an integrated view of human health in biomedical, clinical, and community health contexts. A capstone course focused on content and multi-system integration helps you consolidate the knowledge and skills gained from previous semesters.

Our Medical Sciences curriculum is structured to support student preparation for the USMLE® Step 1 exam as well as clinical clerkships. The curriculum reflects advancements and best practices in medical education to better prepare you for your role as a physician working with dynamic, interprofessional teams.

The Medical Sciences curriculum is built upon the core principles set by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME):

- Medical knowledge
- Interpersonal skills and communication
- · System-based practice
- Professionalism
- Practice-based learning and improvement

Research Foundations

All students participate in community-based research throughout the Medical Sciences curriculum.

Your research will provide you with a deeper understanding of the social determinants of health and the health care needs of local communities.

Our on-campus curriculum runs 20 months (75 weeks). Study modules are spaced out over five semesters, and the curriculum includes integrated study breaks to encourage and manage knowledge acquisition. At the end of our Medical Sciences curriculum, you must pass the USMLE® Step 1 to advance to clinical training.

A Unique Learning Environment

At Ross Med, our wireless campus is contained within the 100,000-square-foot Lloyd Erskine Sandiford Centre (LESC). The center's facilities are equipped with advanced instructional technology and learning systems designed to meet the needs of today's medical students.

- Classrooms and laboratories are equipped with high-resolution monitors connected to state-of-the-art audiovisual equipment, media players, and teleconferencing systems.
- Our accredited* Simulation Institute gives students access to sophisticated lifelike patient simulators to practice basic and diagnostic treatment skills.
- Lecture-based gross anatomy instruction accompanies cadaveric dissection on 3D digital anatomy tables featuring histological, radiological, and ultrasound imaging.



Community Meets Classroom

Our MD curriculum extends beyond the classroom as well. Starting in semester one, the program gives students hands-on experience in local communities, under the supervision of trained physicians.




You will leave Barbados for clinical training, but Ross Med support continues through the Office of Student Services, the Office of Clinical Clerkships, and the Office of Career Advisement.

National Resident Matching Program® (NRMP®)

The NRMP — popularly known as The Match®— is a service that places graduating medical students in residency programs. The Ross Med Office of Career Advisement (OCA) helps prepare students for the matching process and oversees each student's Medical Student Performance Evaluation (MSPE) for participation in the matching process.

In mid-March, during Match Week, students learn if they have been matched with one of their preferred residencies. In 2023, 462 Ross Med graduates matched into a wide variety of medical disciplines.*

Barbados, a Natural Beauty

Barbados is a tropical Caribbean island known for its pristine beaches, coral reefs, turquoise bays, coastal views, and rolling hills, as well as its friendly people and colonial charm. The striking beauty of Barbados makes it a special place to call home during your time at Ross Med.

Barbados Basics

- Easternmost Caribbean island, 669 miles (1,077 km) northeast of Venezuela
- Covers 166 square miles (430 square km); coastline is 60 miles (97 km)
- Barbadian (or Bajan) population: 303,000; Bridgetown: 100,000
- A former British colony, the official language is English.
 Bajan is the local dialect.
- · Barbados is a parliamentary republic.

- Official currency: Barbadian dollar (BBD); U.S. dollar (USD) is also commonly used.
 \$1 BBD = \$0.50 USD
- Barbados is on Atlantic Standard Time, one hour ahead of Eastern Standard Time and equal to Eastern Daylight Time
- Tropical climate with an average daily temperature of 80°F (27°C)
- · National dish: cou-cou and flying fish

Meaningful Accreditation

Ross University School of Medicine is accredited by the Caribbean Accreditation Authority for Education in Medicine and other Health Professions (CAAM-HP www.caam-hp.org) and meets the standards set by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME), the accreditation authority for medical schools in the United States and Canada that provide MD degrees. This means that you may:

- · Qualify for federal student loans and other financial aid.
- Take the United States Medical Licensing Examination® (USMLE®).
- · Pursue residencies and practice medicine in the United States and Canada.
